#### DID YOU KNOW??

Skoolbag is the ultimate school to parent communication tool! The mobile App provides schools with an easy way to tell parents and carers everything they need to know about school news, events, cancellations and reminders. *Did you know that you are able to submit an absent note when your child is away from school via the App.* This is a fast an efficient way to complete (away) notes.

#### For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install".
- 4. The app is FREE to download.
- 5. When installed click "Open"
- ${\bf 6.} \ {\bf Select} \ "{\bf 0}{\bf K}"$  to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

#### For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button.

5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).

- 6. Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.





Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.

For Windows 8.1 Phone and Windows 8.1 or 10 device users:

- 1. Go to the Windows Store on your 8.1 Windows Phone or Windows 8.1/10 Device
- 2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search

3. Install the Skoolbag app

- 4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
- 5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.
- 6. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
- 7. Toggle the Push Categories that are applicable to you by tapping the on/off switch.

#### **Event details:**

If there was ever a space project that totally exceeded the expectations of the scientific world, it has been the Cassini mission to Saturn. Launched in 1997, Cassini reached its target after a seven-year journey, and immediately began re-writing the textbooks. Now, 13 years later, we have a remarkable catalogue of amazing discoveries. Storms and a hexagonal jet-stream in the planet's atmosphere, ripples and spokes in its rings, global oceans and oily seas on its moons – and they are just the start. But the best may be yet to come. With the spacecraft's fuel running out, mission controllers have thrown caution to the winds in an audacious series of orbits that thread Cassini between the rings and the planet before a final plunge into Saturn's atmosphere on 15 September. Celebrate this triumphant mission with Fred Watson, as he presents an entertaining update on all things Cassini. # Work on Bells Line of Road and Grose Vale Road, North Richmond, from Monday 26 June

# The Australian and NSW Governments have committed \$18 million to improve traffic conditions at three key intersections on Kurrajong Road, March Street and Bells Line of Road, on approach to Richmond Bridge.

Roads and Maritime Services is improving the intersection of Bells Line of Road and Grose Vale Road, North Richmond. The project includes:

- · installing or improving dedicated turning lanes on all sides of the intersection
- · providing two westbound lanes from Pitt Lane to about 90 metres west of Grose Vale Road
- removing about 21 parking spaces and relocating bus zones
- installing seven 15 minute parking spaces on the eastbound side of Bells Line of Road to offset the removal of longer term parking necessary for the improvement of the intersection.

We carried out consultation in April and May on a proposed night work schedule for 80 weeks of night work, to help us complete the work as quickly as possible. We are currently considering feedback and will write to you again with the outcome of night work consultation.

#### Our work schedule

Day work will start Monday 26 June and will continue until Monday 31 July, weather permitting. Our day work hours will be between 7am and 6pm from Monday to Friday and between 8am and 1pm on Saturday. No night work will occur until we have announced the outcome of consultation. We will write to you again before starting night work.

Day work will include:

- property adjustments
- utility investigations
- installing signs.

We have included a map to show the location and details of the work.

#### How will the work affect you?

The work will be noisy at times but we will do everything we can to minimise its impact.

#### Traffic changes


There will be some temporary traffic changes during our work hours to ensure the work zone is safe.
