- Are the organisation's philosophy and ethics in harmony with Catholic social teaching?

St Monica's has a strong commitment to social justice through our support of Caritas Australia and Mary MacKillop International (East Timor) as part of our Religious Education curriculum. Teachers and staff also support St Vincent de Paul, the San Miguel Family Centre and Food for All.

St Mary MacKillop's maxim 'Never see a need without doing something about it' challenges us to act when we see hardship, struggle, poverty and lack of opportunities. A small group of committed girls have done just that. They approached Mrs Ryan and myself with a plan to run a competition, raffle and sell stationery and pocket puzzles to our student community in support of Caritas Australia. This level of social awareness is outstanding and I congratulate Charlize S, Alyssa S, Sienna S, Olivia S, Taleisha M, Angelique P, Mikaela F and Tiana H for their efforts. Just over \$500.00 was raised. Each girl will receive a social justice certificate in recognition of their commitment.

"Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:40).

As a way of acknowledging the National Day of Action Against Bullying and Violence (Bullying. No Way!), St Monica's recently welcomed Snr Constable Janine Elliot (Hawkesbury LAC) who presented on Cyber Safety. All children in Years 3-6 attended and Snr Constable Elliot also presented to parents in the afternoon. The main points from her presentation were:

- The dangers associated when chatting and posting online
- Knowing the person with whom you are communicating online
- Parent awareness of children's use of technology
- Once a comment, image etc is posted, it is very difficult to take it back

Again I ask all parents to closely monitor their children's use of social media to ensure not only that they are safe, but that they are using social media respectfully.

I would like to thank Mrs Van Der Burg and Mrs Duval for organising the day.

NAPLAN 2018 Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit for the National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) test in May. The assessments are an opportunity for students to demonstrate what they have learnt in class. Teachers use these results to meet the individual literacy and numeracy needs of all students. The dates for NAPLAN 2018 are 15th-17th May. There are four tests covering numeracy, reading, writing and language conventions (spelling, punctuation and grammar).

SCHOOL ZONES


A reminder to all our parents ahead of the break at the end of Term 1 that school zones remain in place for the safety of our children and families.
