Dear Families,

Term 3 is well underway with the children settling back into their routines and working well. At our first assembly this term, I spoke to the children about developing sound work habits. I specifically mentioned the importance of:

- Listening carefully to instructions and explanations
- Asking clarifying questions when unsure
- Beginning work immediately
- Being organised in their learning space
- Being prepared for each lesson
- Completing tasks

These skills need to be taught and children need to be prompted so that each skill can serve as a strong foundation for successful learning, while at the same time fostering independence in learning. Families can assist in developing these skills by setting goals with children and asking about their learning. On a practical level around the home, giving twostep instructions and imposing time limits on chores can also be of benefit.

Attendance

Parents are reminded of their responsibilities in ensuring that children attend school regularly. The Education Act (1990) outlines these responsibilities in explicit detail. When children are absent from school for any length of time, including late arrival and early departure, a written explanation is required. Without an explanation, the school is required to record the absence as 'unexplained'. Schools and school systems are required to report on student absences each year to the Department of Education and Training. Absences are also reported in our annual audit. I thank you for your continued understanding and support in this important matter.

MATHEMATICS INFORMATION

Welcome back to another school term. Last term we hosted a parent information session and the focus was 'Problem Solving.' It was a very successful morning, sharing and learning with our parent community. To compliment the 'Warm Up' activities children are completing in the classroom, below are a couple of activities you could do at home with your children.

GO 10


Materials: 3-4 players 1 deck of cards, take out the picture cards. Ace = 1

Deal out all the cards. The game is played like Fish, except that each player is trying to make 10. Each pair of cards that makes 10 is placed face up in front of the player who makes it. The winner is the player with the most pairs when no more 10s can be formed.

Knock Knock

Materials: 2-4 players 1 deck of cards. 10 counters

Aces are worth 1; face cards are worth 10. Each player is dealt 4 cards, and the remaining cards become the draw pile. The players take turns taking the top card from the draw pile and discarding one of the cards in their hand. They are trying to make the greatest possible total value. When one player thinks he/she has the largest total, he/she says Knock, Knock. Everyone else has one more turn. Players then add their totals. The winner takes one counter. The game is over when counters are used up.
