Wow...What a wonderful day we had on Monday - Grandparents Day and our book week celebration. It was lovely to see our community coming together again celebrating learning, grandparents and a love of reading.



Parents have asked for maths ideas so they can work with their children at home. We use maths every day, time, distance, money and estimating how much money we need to purchase items.

When you are Baking and cooking it is important to know the quantities of the ingredients that go into your recipe, resulting in 1 very tasty meal / treat. To prevent any unexpected disasters whilst cooking it is important to know the difference between ¼ cup and ¼ teaspoon. Cooking + Fractions = Maths

Looking after your pocket money and spending money. It is important to be accurate in math with the money you have saved, making sure there are no mistakes with your calculations.

Savings + Addition / Subtraction = Maths

Below are some ideas you could do with your child/ren.



For the younger children it could be as simple as counting the cutlery and plates required for the evening meal. Grabbing a hand full of pasta – estimating the amount then count how many pieces there are. Cards are great to use 'SNAP 1 more – 1 less', doubles, picking up 3 cards making a 3 digit number and ordering these from highest to lowest.

For the older children it could be problem solving... (www.edshop.org.au)

- 1. Sam's dad had to cut down a dangerous tree branch. It was 6 metres long. He had to cut it into lengths of $1\frac{1}{2}$ mtrs. How many pieces did he cut?
- 2. Meg bought a 3 metre long electrical cord for her laptop. The cord cost \$7.80. What was the price of the cord per metre?
- 3. A farmer has animals in his barn. He counted 64 legs. What animals could he have in his barn and how many of each animal could he have?
