A few last items:

- A huge 'thank you' to the P&F who recently funded the upgrade to our hall sound system. Their generosity is greatly appreciated!
- The gardens under the Year 3 and Year 4 stairs have recently had the beginnings of a make-over. Terry (maintenance) will complete the makeover in January/February when he plants out both areas. At the same time, he will commence a makeover of the citrus garden between Bourke Street and Year 6. We are very fortunate to have Terry working at St Monica's as he takes great pride in his work.
- The generosity of the St Monica's community has enabled us to contribute \$273 to Rural Aid and \$280 to the Country Women's Association (NSW) drought aid programs.
- Last week, the softfall surrounding the play equipment was replaced and the cricket pitches had new synthetic grass installed.
- In September, I applied for a grant under the Local Schools Community Fund to replace two sections of the play equipment. On Friday, I was informed by Susan Templeman (Federal Member for Macquarie) that the application was successful. Replacement of the two sections will commence in 2020. I take this opportunity to thank Ms Templeman for supporting our grant application and for her ongoing interest in St Monica's School.

As a mother you want your kids to be brave, hopeful and just themselves. So our very first park play at Richmond Park seemed to seal the deal. After a milkshake at the Ugly Mug, we decided that it was going to be great here in Richmond. After all, having an amazing grass playground at St Monica's after



'bouncy cement' in Willoughby was a fabulous start. Not only were the surroundings beautiful with the mountains lining the old streets, we were also unaware in those first few weeks, how much we would be welcomed and cared for by this community.

We scouted, we swam, we did some karate parties, we kayaked in the river, we netballed, we pioneered at the village, we prayed and sang at church, we soccered, we cricketed a few wickets, we trampolined and tumbled, we received academic awards, we danced and we ran the pants off at athletics. We also went to most of the defence events, I learnt a new language in defence acronyms, how to 'pass the port' at dining in nights and the kids felt right at home in the Officer's mess every fortnight at pay night raffle.

Overall, it has been the relationships in all that activity that has made it wonderful. The kind offers of carpooling, the sharing in volunteering, the understanding smiles in the cola, the listening ears, the welcoming coffees, the BBQ's, the dress ups and laughs, the discos, talent shows and award assemblies, and the way we parents are there for each other. It truly is a Christian community without blowing its own trumpet. Yes, there are always issues and hiccups but I can say that happens anywhere, its the way people rise above it that makes the difference and how we stick together that counts. Our faith is in our actions and where necessary, we use kind words of encouragement.

We are very blessed to have been part of such a vibrant and genuine community and these days I can't walk past in the street or at the marketplace without saying hello to someone I know and actually be happy to sit and have coffee on the spur of the moment. Most of all, it surprised me how much we were accepted and not put aside 'as defence people' as it would be easier to just let us come and go and asume we will be gone in a few years without really caring. But this has not been our experience and we will miss everyone so much but also look forward to those times when we visit to share all your news. You are truly there to support serving members in the present day and we will hold our first posting very dear to our hearts. My prayer for you is that you keep letting your light shine and walk with the Spirit in everything you do.

1. Plan

- Get your kids involved in making a list of activities that they would like to do

- · Schedule down time and time out as well as time for one-on-one and family group activities

2. The best things in life are free

 Make sure the list includes plenty of free activities such as picnics, bike rides, trips to the beach, the local library and the great outdoors

3. Boredom is good

Unstructured time and time away from electronic devices is good for young minds

4. Use opportunities to teach new skills and self reliance

Not having the pressure to rush out the door in the morning can allow for kids to develop new skills such as
getting their own breakfast and lunch, taking the dog for a walk or going to the shops by themselves







5. Ask for help

 Don't be afraid to ask for help to share the load. For example, asking friends or family to help care for children or to provide assistance in other ways

Consider if it's really worth maintaining the tradition when it may be at the cost of mental health and wellbeing

- Parent Line can also provide over the phone support throughout the holiday period if you need some

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




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
