GIVIT coordinating donations and offers of assistance to help people affected by severe storms and flooding



LOCKDOWN DRILL



Earlier in the year, the students participated in an evacuation drill and we were pleased with the mature and prompt response of all involved. On Thursday morning, students will participate in a Lockdown drill with their teachers and peers. In some emergency situations, an evacuation of a building and/or classroom is not advisable. These may include a hostile intruder, criminal activity near the school or vicious animals near/in playground. General emergency lockdown procedures are developed and practised in the unlikely event a lockdown should occur. We know that the concept of a lockdown can



This draft new curriculum for Religious Education will be known as **Living Life to the Full** and is now available on the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta website together with a guide to help community members learn more.

<u>RE Living Life to the Full explained</u>

Faithful to Sacred Scripture and Tradition, Catholic Teaching and Values, **Living Life to the Full** is designed to be ageappropriate for children and young people. When it is launched in late 2021 the Draft New Curriculum will replace 'Sharing Our Story', the current curriculum that has been in place for more than 20 years.

CARING FOR THE ENVIRONMENT AT ST MONICA'S



Last week and earlier this term you may have noticed some work being done around the school.

We have been the recipient of a Diocesan wide commitment to reduce our schools impact on the environment by having new solar panels installed at the school and just recently LED lights installed in all our admin and learning spaces including the library. LED lights use around half the energy of older style lights and last about five times longer, meaning they don't need to be replaced as often and draw down less energy from the electricity grid. In addition to being better for the environment, the LEDs also enhance the learning experience for students by providing improved lighting levels in classrooms. We are very grateful to have the support of CEDP in making our school better and more sustainable.

UNIFORMS - PLEASE LABEL EVERYTHING

Unfortunately, we have a lot of jumpers/jackets in lost property, some with names and others without. If you purchase a second-hand item, please also make sure that you cross out the old name and mark it with your child's name. We also ask that you regularly check the jumper/jacket that your child comes home with as they may have inadvertently picked up someone else's. Often names on jumpers are on the back side of the tag. While we regularly sort through the lost property collection, since the weather has become cooler, we are unable to keep up with the ever increasing pile. Please feel free to look through the collection when you come to pick up your child in the afternoon. It is a shame that so many items do not get claimed.

- how eSafety can help when things go wrong.


